Biobot Analytics | 2017 cohort

Biobot Analytics analyzes wastewater to monitor the spread of respiratory illnesses and high-risk drug use, to predict disease clusters & outbreaks, optimize health resources, and fuel breakthroughs in disease treatment.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, Biobot was first to build a test to gauge virus levels in wastewater, eventually collaborating with CDC and government entities. Time Magazine lauded Biobot as one of the Best Inventions of 2022. Biobot went through Y Combinator and attracted funding from The Engine, Pioneer Fund and others.

Forma Systems | 2025 cohort

Forma developed technology that uses up to 72% less cement and up to 67% less steel than conventional flat concrete floor slabs with proprietary optimization software & 3D-printed mold fabrication. Forma expands access to high-quality, low-carbon affordable housing & building systems

After winning a grant through the IDEAS Challenge, Forma won the top prize of \$100,000 at the MIT Climate & Energy Prize competition.





Takachar | 2012 cohort

Takachar develops affordable, small-scale, portable technology that attaches to tractors in remote farms. The machine converts crop residue into sellable bio-products like fuel and fertilizer. Their Takavator Mini Unit is deployed in Southern India, on the west coast of the US, and in British Columbia, Canada. In 2023, Takachar processed 400 tons of biomass and avoided 800 tons of CO2e emissions.

In 2021, Takachar won the Earthshot Prize, funded by Prince William and Princess Catherine.

How IDEAS works

MIT's home for early-stage social innovation.

From idea to impact through a comprehensive curriculum, mentorship, funding, and robust network of critical support.

Discover & Define

Students identify a real-world challenge, build relationships with the most affected communities, form teams, and work through learning experiences to prepare to submit strong applications.

Prototype & Test

Teams apply, interview, and are selected for the incubator. Teams develop early interventions using community-centered frameworks, theories of change, and systems-level analyses.

Apply & Pitch

Students submit refined proposals and pitch to expert judges for a chance to win up to \$20,000 in additional grant funding.

Launch & Learn

Winning teams pilot their ideas with continued support from mentors, advisors, and the IDEAS network for the next 18 months.









Since 2001, IDEAS has empowered MIT studentled teams to address social and environmental challenges through social entrepreneurship. Students recruit global teammates and co-create solutions with community partners and stakeholders.

Through incubator programs, peer to peer exchange, and practical mentorship, teams build skills in collaboration, systems thinking, and impact measurement, supported by partners, reviewers, and seed funding of \$1,000, with up to \$20,000 in follow-on grants available.
