The Program Coordinator for Student Engagement and Outreach, Priscilla King Gray Center for Public Service (PKG Center), will 1) use a data-driven approach to recruit students to participate in PKG Center programs and events 2) develop and deliver trainings and workshops and 3) provide programmatic support to the PKG Center portfolio of programs. The Program Coordinator will report to the PKG Center's Assistant Dean of Social Innovation.

The PKG Center, housed in MIT's Office of the Vice Chancellor, taps and expands MIT students' unique skills and interests to prepare them to explore and address complex social and environmental challenges including health equity, using technology for social good, climate change, and racial justice. We educate students to collaborate ethically and effectively with community partners to engage in meaningful public service, today and in their lives beyond MIT.

The successful candidate will join our team of 8 full-time staff and a cohort of Graduate Assistants from local universities.

# Characteristic Duties and Responsibilities:

Student Outreach, Communications, and Engagement (50%)

- Develop and deploy a data-informed strategic approach for recruiting and engaging MIT students
- Cultivate and manage internal relationships with departments, labs, centers, student groups, residence halls, and others to promote the PKG Center's portfolio of programs
- Develop and maintain a relationship management system that documents the PKG Center's key current internal partnerships, highlights areas of opportunity, and centralizes outreach communications
- Analyze data to develop and implement comprehensive yearly outreach plans with each program manager
- Manage and disseminate appealing student-facing recruitment materials and swag for all PKG programs and events



- Plan, host, and/or join activities and events to recruit students
- Promote the PKG portfolio of offerings on social media, in coordination with the Development + Communications Officer and Graduate Assistants
- Engage and cultivate PKG student ambassadors and student outreach staff; recommend students to represent the PKG Center at donor, alumni, and other events
- Field inquiries from students and connect them to PKG and other MIT social impact programs. Maintain social impact asset map for MIT
- Analyze and assess student participation and trends outreach across the PKG Center
  - Maintain and manage central PKG data portal, in coordination with Program Assistant
  - Prepare participation data and program accomplishments for reports, in consultation with program leads

### Workshops + Trainings (20%)

- Develop and deliver workshops and trainings for PKG programs, in consultation with program leads and in alignment with PKG Center strategy
- Develop and deliver workshops and trainings for MIT internal partners and student groups when aligned with strategic outreach strategy
- Recommend other MIT trainings/offerings as appropriate
- Advise students and student organizations on best practices for planning, organizing, implementing, and reflecting on ethical and effective public service activities
- Assess and refresh "Get Good Stuff Done" program series with campus partners

# Program Support (30%)

- Provide equitable program support to all PKG Center programs as determined by annual Center portfolio planning
- Support MIT's civic engagement and voter outreach efforts in consultation with Associate Dean + Director
